Bronze Trophy

A qualifier for the Bronze Trophy will be held on May 6th, 2026.

The top 8 low net players will qualify to play for the Bronze Trophy.

Games should be played outside of the Wednesday games and be finished up by mid August, if possible.



Jowsey Trophy

Awarded to the player with the lowest total of best 10 putting scores.

(Match responsible for)



Captain's Trophy

The Eclectic Committee records scores for every hole played on Ladies' Day for every member of The Club. When a player betters a score on any hole(s), the new score(s) will be noted and changed. At the end of the playing season, the 18 holes will be totaled for each player. Lowest gross score wins the trophy.

(Eclectic responsible for)



Mary Goard Trophy

This will be played on June 10, 2026.

Partner Low Net 18-hole stroke play event. The Low Net scores of both players are added together for a combined total low net score. Lowest combined net score wins the trophy.

Match Committee assigns partners.



Fred Sweet/Money Memorial Trophy

Alternate trophy names from year to year. Fred Sweet is awarded in even years and Money Memorial in odd years. Individual 36-Hole – Low Net – Stroke Play competition played over two consecutive Wednesdays (Sept. 9 & Sept. 16, 2026).

Rose Bowl

Awarded to the player with the lowest total of her 8 best qualifying low net games during the current season.

(Match responsible for)



Polly Putter

Awarded to the player with the lowest one game putting total on a Wednesday.

(Match responsible for)



Muriel Reid Trophy

Awarded to the player with the greatest handicap reduction.
Each player's handicap at the start of the season and season's end is used for calculation.
Handicap season is from September 30th to September 30th.

Note: player must have played for two consecutive years of 20 or more games in each year to be eligible for the Handicap Reduction Award (Muriel Reid Trophy).

2.2a For an 18-hole Score For an 18-hole score to be acceptable for handicap purposes, a minimum of 10 holes must be played.

2.2b For a 9-hole Score For a 9-hole score to be acceptable for handicap purposes, all 9 holes must be played.

For holes not played: calculate Par plus number of strokes you get on the hole.

18 HOLE LADIES' CLUB CHAMPIONSHIP



Eligibility:

Must be a member of the 18 Hole Ladies' Club. A **new** member must play at least 6 games on Ladies' Day (Wednesdays) before scheduled tournament dates to be eligible.

Format:

36-hole stroke play – 2 day (August 12th & August 19th, 2026)

Awards presented to:

- Overall Low Gross and Runner-Up
- Overall Low Net and Runner-Up
- Flighted Gross and Net

The Match Committee is responsible for determining the flights

Any ties will be broken by matching scorecards (9-6-3-1).

The 18-Hole Ladies' Low Gross and Low Net winners are eligible to represent our Club in the Zone 6 Champion of Champions Tournament. If they are unable to participate the Runners Up may take their place.

THE HANDICAP CHAIR is responsible for the Muriel Reid Trophy for handicap reduction.

THE ECLECTIC CHAIR is responsible for the Captain's Trophy.

THE MATCH CHAIR is responsible for the Rose Bowl, Mary Goard, Fred Sweet/Money Memorial, Jowsey and Polly Putter trophies.

Zone qualifiers (if required) are held on a Ladies' Days (Wednesdays). Zone qualifiers can be played in conjunction with other games for those not wishing to qualify. Instructions will be sent out before each qualifying round by the Match Committee, if necessary.

HOLE-IN- ONE MARKERS & EAGLE PINS

Hole-In-One markers are given to a player who scores an "Ace" on any eligible course and at any time as long as it is witnessed and attested to. Scorecard showing the "Ace" must be given to Ladies' Captain. The Match Committee decides which courses are eligible.

An Eagle Pin is awarded to any player who scores an Eagle during Ladies' Day play.

Break 80, 90, 100 PINS/MARKERS

These pins/markers are available to any member who breaks 80, 90, or 100 for the first time ever while playing under The Rules of Golf at QBMGC. 18 holes (or Continuous 9 holes) must be played and the scores must be certified. Scorecards are to be given to ladies' Captain. The Match Committee will determine when members are eligible to receive these pins.

“Bits and Pieces”

Guests:

The 18 Hole Ladies’ Club allows all female members of QBMGC and green fee players to play as “guests” up to four times a season (not on trophy days). If the guest(s) contribute to the “pots”, they will be eligible to share in the winnings in the game they are participating in. They will not be eligible for a PIN.

Posting of Scorecards:

“Almost all scores are acceptable because the basic premise of the Golf Canada Handicap System is that every player will try his or her best on every hole, in every round regardless of where the round was played.” (Golf Canada)

Please post ALL of your scores to Golf Canada, hole by hole, on the day played. If you forget, post the score as soon as possible. All rounds played on any day must be recorded to ensure a valid handicap.

Our Handicap Chair is always available for any questions concerning handicapping and scorecards.

Wednesday Games:

Refer to Fixture Sheet for dates and games to be played. Description and rules for games will be sent prior to game to be played.

Scorecards are to be submitted immediately after the Wednesday game played. The scorecards are to be placed in the basket in the locker room. **The scorecards will be used to determine weekly winners.**

Players are responsible for entering your scores into the computer. Handicap will use the scorecards to verify your computer scores. Please remember to bring extra scorecards with you before heading out to play your game. Keep a separate card with your score to enter at Golf Canada, hole by hole.

POTS

ALL POTS ARE OPTIONAL AND WILL COST \$1.00 EACH, WITH THE EXCEPTION OF THE GULLY KP, WHICH WILL COST \$2.00

You must pay into the pots before the game, not during or after the game.

You can choose to contribute to as many pots as you would like. Be sure to indicate which pot(s) you are participating in on the sheet provided each week.

All winnings will be distributed the following week of the game played. If a pot is not won, the prize money for that pot will be carried over week to week, until won.

WEEKLY GAME POT:

If you choose **not** to participate in the Game Pot, your score **will be honored** but there will be no cash amount awarded.

KP IN TWO:

The KP In Two goes to the player who gets closest to the pin after their second shot on the hole. Match will switch between using Hole 2/11 and 9/18.

LONGEST PUTT:

The Longest Putt goes to the player who makes the longest putt between their last putt and the hole. Match will switch between using Hole 2/11 and 9/18.

LOWEST PUTTS:

The Lowest Putts goes to the player who makes the fewest putts throughout their round.

CHIP INS:

A player who plays a hole without having to make a putt from the green has a “Chip In”. There is a chance for multiple winners and a pot split.

GULLY HOLE (5/14) KP:

Gully Hole KP goes to the player who is closest to the pin after one shot – on either #5 or #14.

The Spirit of Golf is defined by Golf Canada as:

“Golf is played, for the most part, without the supervision of a referee or umpire. The game relies on the individual to show consideration for other players and to play by the Rules. All players should show courtesy and sportsmanship at all times, no matter how competitive they may be. This is the spirit of the game of golf.”

While there are no specific penalties for breach of Etiquette, many breaches can be considered serious misconducts and are listed under Rule 1.2 Standards of Player Conduct. The application of a penalty for a serious misconduct is at the discretion of the Committee (Captain, Rules Chair, Match Chair) and may take the form of a warning or disqualification.
